MISS ESTA GOETTSCH DIES FOLLOWING SHORT ILLNESS

Miss Esta Luverne Goettsch, eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Goettsch, passed away at her home, yesterday morning at 6:20 o'clock. She was taken ill March 14th with the grippe, which turned into pneumonia last Friday night, and regardless of all that loving hands could do, her condition steadily grew more critical.

Esta was born in this city April 25, 1906, and lived here all her life. She was a member of this year's graduating class of the Luverne high school and was one of the most popular members. Her sweet and loving manner endeared her to all with whom she came in contact. Throughout her school career she has always been an exceptionally bright and remarkable student. This year she won third highest honors in her class.

She leaves to mourn her loss her grief stricken father and mother and one sister, Helon Goettsch, who have the heartfelt sympathy of all, in their sorrow.

Funeral services have been arranged for Saturday at 2:30 o'clock from the Goettsch residence with Rev. Carver of the Presbyterian church, officiating. Music will be furnished by the choir of the church where Esta Goettsch was an active member of the Sunday school. Miss Elsie White, a member of the class of 1922, will be the accompanist.

The Misses Opal Hunter, Philona Landes, Mabel Preston, Lulu Hanson, Iris Wedge and Elizabeth Martin have been named as the honorary pallbearers, and Russell Wiggins, Albert Haakinson, Herbert Nelson, Raymond Campbell, Dell McCoy and Rex Leslie will be active pallbearers. Interment will be made at Maplewood cemetery.

The casket will be open between the hours of 12:30 o'clock and 1:30 o'clock Saturday when schoolmates and friends may feel welcome to visit the home and view the remains.

An exceptionally large number of

friends of the family attended the funeral of Miss Esta Luverne Goettsch, which was held from the home of Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Goettsch Saturday afternoon, the Dr. A. H. Carver officiating. The uncommonly profuse and beautiful floral offerings bespoke the esteem in which the deceased was held by friends and classmates. Interment was made at Maplewood.
